Purdy Produce Plot Planters, Pickers, and Preparers:

The prolific lettuce crop is dwindling but has provided tossed salad for all our Food for the Soul guests for

four consecutive Saturday meals with extra greens for guests to take home. Our harvest has been about 65 pounds. The price of organic mixed greens in the store seems to range from \$1.99- \$3.49 for a 5 oz. bag. You can do the math to determine the monetary value of the vitamin packed, fresh greens we provided from our church garden and there was very little fuel used to get it into our church kitchen. It did not come without labor, however.

Kathy Michel, Terry Berry, Terry Stewart, Helen Johnston and Marsha Dubbels have been dedicated volunteers cleaning and bagging all that lettuce. In addition to the lettuce, one of our garden volunteers, Sonja DeMulder donated a huge quantity of kale and 2-3 pounds of lettuce. There were bags of kale for guests to take home last Saturday.

We have had help in the garden but can always use more. The photos should indicate that no one is too young to volunteer. Fortunately, we have had recent rain, so watering won't be needed again. Volunteer help on Saturday evenings is always welcome. There is always something that needs to be done.
