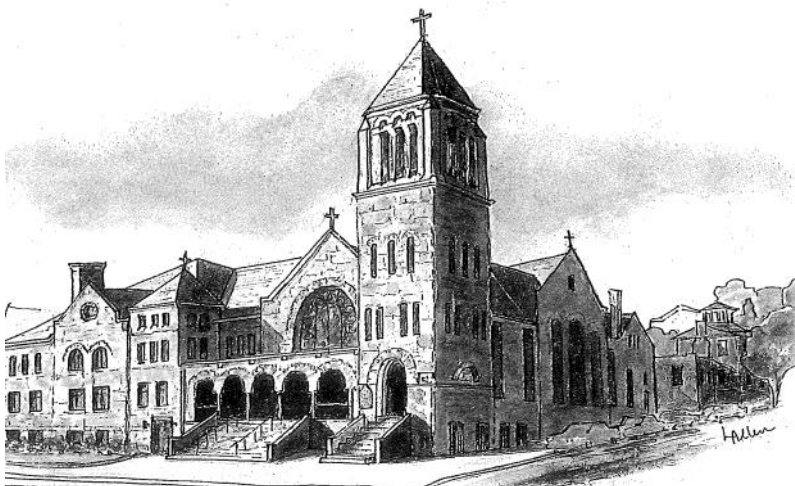

Iowa United Methodist Annual Conference

CREATING DIFFERENCE MAKERS!

2017 Annual Conference was convened by our Bishop Laurie Haller on June 10-12 at Hy-Vee Hall in Des Moines. This is the 174th yearly meeting! *It featured powerful preaching, inspiring singing, informative teaching sessions, vital reporting and voting, and the reconnection of United Methodists from across Iowa.*

Annual Conference is a partnership gathering of United Methodist clergy and lay persons as delegates. Nancy Bradley and Sue Hattel were voting delegates representing St. Luke's. Others attending from St. Luke's included Rev. Chuck Layton; Rev. Dianne Christopher, a retired Full Elder and member of St. Luke's; and Marcia Young, an elected Iowa delegate to General and Jurisdictional United Methodist Conferences and member of St. Luke's.

Bishop Laurie's Episcopal Address "**ARE YOU A DIFFERENCE MAKER?**" set the focus for the entire Annual Conference. Voting items included "*Caring for our Earth*" and "*Support of Mental Illness.*" We voted to encourage the Bishop to form a task force for the Iowa Conference to support increased inpatient beds, increased community based treatment and more trained psychiatrists in Iowa. We also encouraged the Conference to work with NAMI and others for education, training, advocacy etc about mental illness.

A commission established *Finding Our Way Forward* at General Conference of the United Methodist Church in 2016 continues the discussion topic about our understanding of human sexuality. Its work will continue for several years. We are called to be faithful in this time of discussion.

During the Annual Conference we joined our hearts and voices, singing "*Go Make a Difference*" by Angrisano & Tomaszek. Bishop Laurie proclaimed that "as Iowa United Methodists, we are God's hope for the world!"
