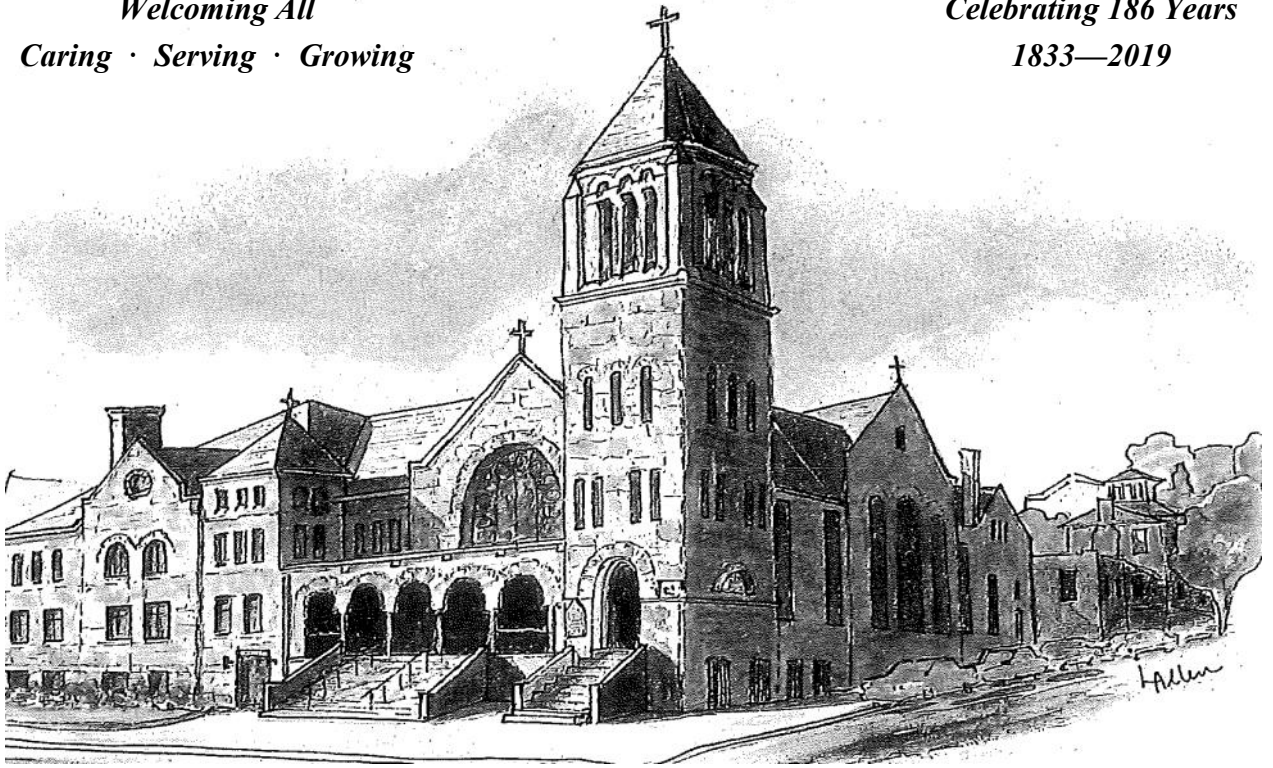

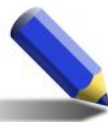

Nourishing snacks are needed for Habitat for Humanity! **Can you assist?** St. Luke's has been in a covenant relationship with Dubuque & Jackson Counties Habitat for Humanity for many years, including financial support from St. Luke's as well as meals for at least four builds. The City of Dubuque will be renovating a duplex at 1100 Roosevelt Road, off Peru Road, into a single family home. Completion is projected for November. The future owners will be a single mother with four school age children. **They have been waiting for 2 years for this and are so excited!** July 24-26 is a work weekend coming up where snacks are needed for 10 volunteers per shift with shifts 8-12 and 1-4 for each of the three work days.

Suggestions for snacks include:

- ◆ Granola bars — that don't melt in heat
- ◆ Trail mix — homemade or purchased
- ◆ Fruit — apples, clementines, grapes, bananas
- ◆ Lemonade or iced tea
- ◆ Money to purchase items (if need be)

Snack donations need to be in the St. Luke's kitchenette (center room off the South Hall, main floor) by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday July 23rd.

Habitat will furnish water. No volunteers are needed on site and workers will take breaks at their convenience.
