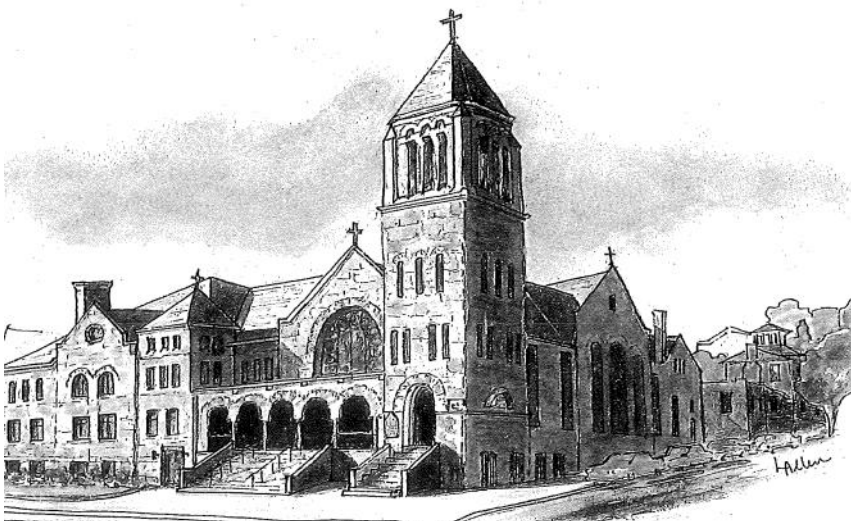

Purdy Produce Plot St. Luke's Church Garden:

The garden has yielded produce for our Food for the Soul meals. On June 11th, there were 18 pounds of lettuce for the meal and available to take home. That was the yield from only half the rows. In a recent survey by St. Stephen's AmeriCorps volunteer, guests at free meal sites listed greens of all kinds among their favorite vegetables to be served. Lettuce salad will be on the menu again on June 18th.



Lori, the owner of Murphy's Gardens, donated 55 beautiful, healthy tomato plants, 9 pepper plants and a flat of onions to our church garden. She has been a generous supporter of our church garden in the past, as well. Express our gratitude if you see her. We now have 71 tomato plants in the ground with another 25-30 needing a place to settle. We have plenty of room but may need extra forces to pick if they all yield.

Chris Purdy devoted many hours to tilling and laying down landscape fabric. Ken Miller has been a faithful volunteer in the garden, tackling some major weed takeovers. Saturday morning, four youth from Hope Church spent time weeding and mulching in the garden.
