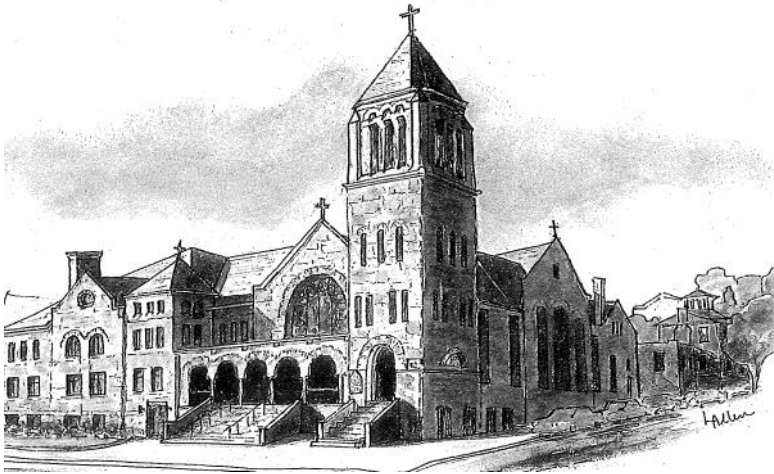

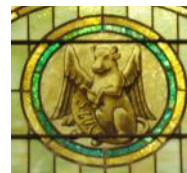

## *Prescott Blood Drive*

St Luke's Congregation,

Today I received a note from our Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center coordinator Sharee Hoegerl with some interesting facts I wanted to share with you to think about.

Sharee said since we restarted the blood drive in 2013 we have collected 381 units of blood which means that when you consider each unit can touch up to 4 patients means we have provided over 1500 blood products to people who needed them!

She also mentions we have brought 72 new donors into their drives as donors in the past six years. She also tells me we have collectively raised \$3,641.00 for Prescott school by consistently meeting our blood drive goals or exceeding them. To remind you this money comes in the form of a voucher the school can spend on resources of their choice. In the past they have purchased software for reading and books and this most recent check will help with extra training for staff at Prescott.

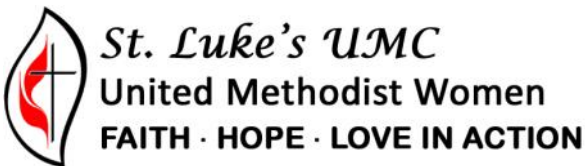
Our most recent drive on May 6 our goal was 24 and we ended up with 28 units collected! She also mentions that the mobile blood drives account for over half their annual collections so it is a big part of their network. She also says don't forget what a worthwhile endeavor it is to keep families whole which is fulfilling their mission as well as ours!

So this reminds me of the person who was walking the beach throwing starfish back in the ocean that had washed ashore. Another person asks if the person throwing the starfish thinks they can save them all and the person responds of course not but for the one I just threw back I did! That's what we are doing when we donate our units of blood only we are helping up to 4 people with each unit!

Thanks to our regular donors and thanks to those who said yes for the first time as well! I hope we can continue this important community service for a long time to come! Next drive will be Monday November 18, 2019 at Prescott School as in the past. I will start reminding the congregation in early August!

## St. Luke's "Jesus Fund" Food Voucher Program

St. Luke's "Jesus Fund" provides vouchers (gift certificates) from Eagle's Country Market (grocery store) for people in need in the area. St. Luke's vouchers specify that the vouchers are only good for **healthy foods**: meat, milk, dairy, cheese, fruits and vegetables (produce, canned, or frozen). This maximizes users' nutritional intake. Bread is available for free at our free Saturday night meal, Food for the Soul (served at 5:30 p.m. every Saturday night, doors open around 4:00 p.m.). The Jesus Fund program helps supplement



people's food buying when their government benefits don't stretch, when other food pantry or distribution programs' supplies run out, and just to help make ends meet.

**The Jesus Fund is out of funds and has been out for a couple weeks.** Generosity is great from Thanksgiving through Easter, particularly due to the assistance we receive from our Fabulous Friday concert program. However in the summer, we often find ourselves having to tell people we have no funds. Most people who utilize these funds support children, and food is more scarce in summer due to school lunch programs being inactive.

**To Donate:** On Sunday, leave checks in an envelope labeled "**Jesus Fund**" in the offering plate; or mail your donation with check made out to: St. Luke's, 1199 Main St, Dubuque, IA 52001. Put "**Jesus Fund**" in the check memo line.
