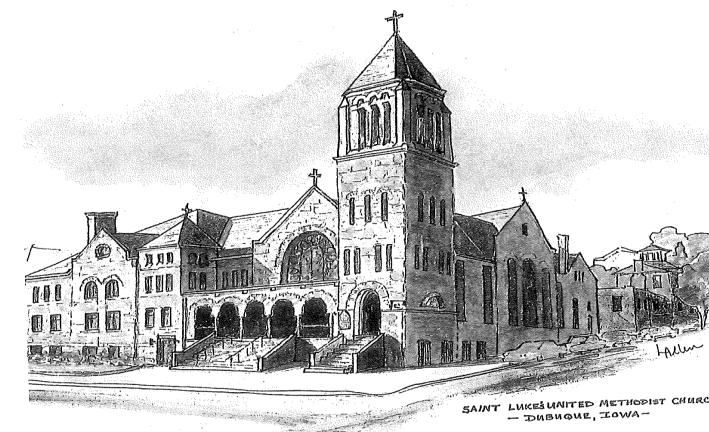

- ◆ New toothbrushes in original sealed wrapper, **NOT** child-sized
- ◆ Nail Files or fingernail clippers (**NO** emery boards or toenail clippers)

School Kit items most needed:

- ◆ Notebooks approx. 8 1/2 x 11, wide-ruled, spiral or bound, 70 or 80 sheets
- ◆ Metric ruler, 30 cm
- ◆ Hand pencil sharpeners, at least 1 inch long

No items can have advertising, religious symbols, or national flags on them. These gifts need to be delivered to the display in the South Hall on or before Sunday, November 1.

You may have thought the garden was done producing, but every Thursday there has been harvesting and hauling to the church where some of our faithful preparer volunteers have worked washing, slicing and dicing vegetables. There have been enough of some vegetables and fruit (cantaloupe) to serve at the meals for the last several weeks as well as some vegetables to give away to the guests. They disappear off the table within minutes of the doors opening. We have, in fact, planted some fall garden of snap peas and kale and the brussel sprouts are best after a frost so the garden will still be in production for awhile yet.

So far half a row of potatoes have been dug yielding 30 pounds of very nice potatoes. **Help would be mightily appreciated to help dig more potatoes**, but it will take someone being here who is familiar with the plot to find the little tell tale dried stems amidst the weeds to help someone dig. If you have a little time to spare, please consider helping with this project.
