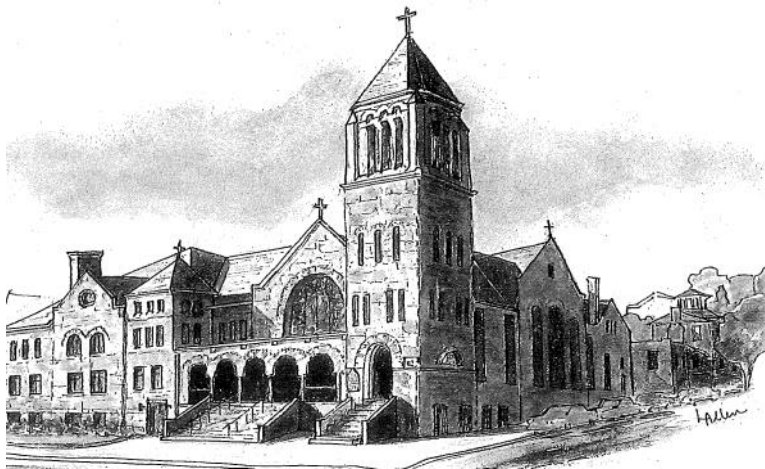

Invitation

Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, and seek to live in peace with one another. Sometimes, the very place where healing is offered is a most uncomfortable place to be. We wonder, "Can I show my face at Jesus' table?" or we say, "There's no way I can take communion while that person is here." It is not God who puts such barriers in front of us. Rather, it is our sin or brokenness. Therefore, let us confess our sin and brokenness before God and one another.

Confession

God whose strength is irresistible, but whose gentleness respects our weakness, we confess those broken places that make our lives hurt. Those of us who are angry confess that too often we let our anger control us. We who look to substances like food or alcohol, or to relationships to fill the God-shaped emptiness within us confess that we are hungry but don't turn to you, the Living Bread of Heaven. We who operate out of fear or pain confess that it is so hard to let you love us into health. Restore us to your image, loving God. Heal us. Bring us back into relationship with others and with you.

May almighty God, who caused light to shine out of darkness, shine in our hearts, cleansing us from all our sins, and restoring us to the light of the knowledge of God's glory, in the face of Jesus Christ, our Savior. Amen.
