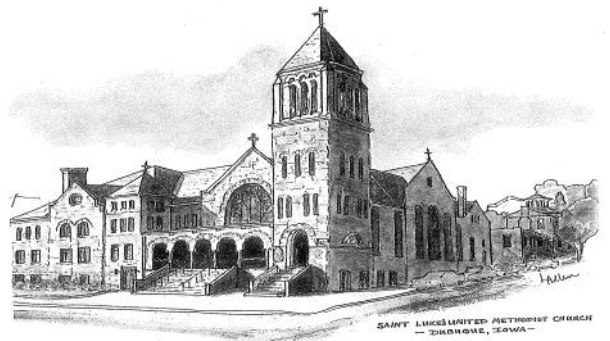

Chuck's Chat — December 27, 2017

On this last "Chuck's Chat" of 2017, I'd like to share what I believe Jesus is saying to St. Luke's:

"My dear friends, I love you so much! How glad I am to receive your praise and worship at the worship services. How proud I am that you do your good works in my name. I know that this has been a difficult year for some of you. Some have lost loved ones. Remember how I said in John's gospel: ²⁷My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand." (John 10:27)

Tiffany Name Meaning

While the brand name of our "Tiffany Windows" is named after the Tiffany family, the origin of the name "Tiffany" is directly related to Epiphany.

The name "Tiffany" is of Greek origin and means "revelation of God." It is a variant of the Greek *Theophania*. In many Christian countries, girls born on January 6th, the Feast of the Epiphany, are given some form of this name. The feast commemorates the day when the three Magi saw the infant Jesus. Because the Magi were Gentiles, their visit to the baby Jesus is the "revelation of God" to the world of the Gentiles.

Fabulous Fridays Artist Series 2018

Fabulous Fridays return to St. Luke's United Methodist Church on January 12, 2018. Now in its 27th season, this popular series began in 1992 with musicians from St. Luke's and grew to include locally and nationally recognized artists. More than 200 artists have performed for these informal downtown concerts during the series' history.

Performances begin at 12:05 p.m. and are 30 minutes in length. Many in the audience bring their lunch and enjoy time together after the concert in the Fellowship Hall, where coffee and desserts are available.
