

### **Tiffany Name Meaning**

While the brand name of our "Tiffany Windows" is named after the Tiffany family, the origin of the name "Tiffany" is directly related to Epiphany.

The name "Tiffany" is of Greek origin and means "revelation of God." It is a variant of the Greek *Theophania*. In many Christian countries, girls born on January 6th, the Feast of the Epiphany, are given some form of

this name. The feast commemorates the day when the three Magi saw the infant Jesus. Because the Magi were Gentiles, their visit to the baby Jesus is the "revelation of God" to the world of the Gentiles.




