

Chuck's Chat — December 29, 2016

A secret in plain sight! That's what I found just now in the sanctuary. I want to tell you all what I found, but I also don't want to take away your joy and wonder at finding it for yourself. So I'm just going to say, "look with fresh eyes at some of the things in our worship space and you might find a blessing.

Life in the spirit can be like that. A person can say, "there's something so wonderful that I want you to experience! But I can only point you in the right direction. You have to find it for yourself." Soon, the new year will be here, and with it all sorts of expectation and hope. It may be that you hope for a new, deeper, more durable and rich relationship with God. In a sense, my advice is the same as for finding the secret in plain sight in the church: Go with open eyes and look afresh at what you've always seen.

Go with fresh eyes to the Bible. Look again at Isaiah 30:18-20. ¹⁸Therefore the Lord waits to be gracious to you; therefore he will rise up to show mercy to you. For the Lord is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for God. ¹⁹Truly, O people in Zion, inhabitants of Jerusalem, you shall weep no more. God will surely be gracious to you at the sound of your cry; hearing it, God will answer you. ²⁰Though the Lord may give you the bread of adversity and the water of affliction, yet your Teacher will not hide any more, but your eves shall see your Teacher.

Go with fresh eyes to your life. What is your Teacher trying to help you learn about life in the spirit when you are blessed with good things? What can you learn when problems or pain come? If nothing else, we can learn that the same God who loves us in good times also loves us in bad. That is *really* a secret to most people. How hard it is to bless God for pain or adversity! Yet, if we trust that God is the same yesterday, today and forever, then the same God who loves us on a warm sunny day is the God who loves us in the grip of the tornado.

Go with fresh eyes to the world. For all the pain and trouble of this old world, God loves us still. God loves the oppressor enough to see them give up oppressing, and the oppressed enough to proclaim justice and mercy for them. Remember how Jesus met Zacchaeus man-to-man and called him from a life of oppressing to a life of loving service! God loves those blessed with wealth, as well as those living in poverty. God loves the wealthy ones enough to offer them great opportunities to feel the joy of helping their fellow humans. God loves the poor enough to lift them up and place them in the path of folks with resources.

Go with fresh eyes to the little things. Learn to see God in the well-washed pot, in the well-written thank-you note, in the grace to let the other person get in front of you in line. Morning by morning, greet God in this way: "Good morning, Lord! Open my eyes to see you at work today!"

Dubuque Rescue Mission needs clean, new or gently used men's coats, hats, gloves, socks, shoes, boots, or other cold weather gear and new underwear for their residents. If you have those items for the men who live at the Mission, take them to the Dubuque Rescue Mission store on Main Street. Designate that you want it to go to the residents and not into the resale shop. You can receive a donation receipt. The Rescue Mission can also always use laundry detergent, men's toiletries including shampoo, deodorant, shaving cream, razors, etc. and new twin bed sheets and blankets.

St. John's Church Open Closet needs clean, new or gently used winter coats, hats, gloves/mittens, scarfs, boots and shoes for men, women and children, as well as sheets, blankets, pillowcases and towels and children's books in **very good** condition. They can accept only NEW underwear and socks still in their packages. Take them to the grey, alley door behind the north side of the church on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday mornings 8-11 a.m. or on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month 9-11 a.m. or by appointment. Their comments make it apparent they recognize that St. Luke's makes a difference in the foods they have available.

The Dubuque Food Pantry is dividing some funding up among the community providers of free meals. It is an effort to make food more accessible than it can otherwise be when it is just inside the Food Pantry. St. Luke's received \$700 in this rotation of recipient selection and can apply again for the next application period in the first quarter of the new year. How this money will be used to enhance our food program will soon be determined.

We are thankful to both of these organizations for helping us address the needs for food in our community.
