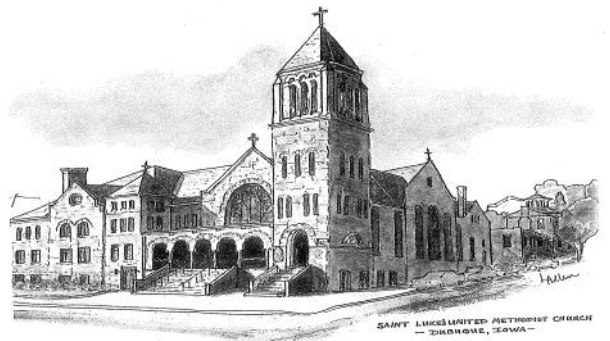

Chuck's Chat — January 11, 2016

When do you feel closest to God? In St. Luke's amazing sanctuary? Sitting with your child sleeping in your arms? Talking with a very old and dear friend? Reading your Bible and discussing the coming day with God over morning coffee? Having a great discussion with your Sunday School class or small group? Out in nature? Praying during your morning commute? Receiving Communion?

I feel close to God at many of those times, as well as when I'm in a hospital room talking with someone about ultimate concerns, or when I'm breaking the bread and raising the cup at communion. There's another time when I feel close to God. It's when the offering plate with my offering is placed on the altar.

This last Sunday, I brought back what was, for me, a very meaningful part of the worship service: the song "We Give Thee but Thine Own." Growing up, I thought it was a rule that all United Methodist churches had to sing the first verse of this at the offering. I still don't understand why it didn't make it into the new hymnal. I have sung those words so often that they are a part of me.

"We give thee but thine own,
whate'er the gift may be.
All that we have is thine alone,
a trust O Lord, from thee."

This is truly deep theology. Everything we have is a trust from God. Not just our money, or our possessions. Our health, family, mind, heart, passions, enjoyments, and all else that makes us who we are—all these started out in God's hand, and whatever we offer up to God is only returning to its rightful home.

- When an elderly person lying in a hospital bed says that, if they had their preference, they would die immediately, but that they know their life is in God's hands, I am in the presence of God.
- When a young child first learns to offer the Lord's Prayer up to God, I'm in the presence of God.
- When Someone who has so little material wealth that I wonder how they get through the week, puts an offering in my hands and says, "Please give this to someone who needs it!" I'm in the presence of God.
- When someone wrestles with which ministry they should devote time and energy to, I'm in the presence of God.

And when the congregation comes together on Sunday, placing their tithes and offerings upon God's altar, we are in the presence of God.

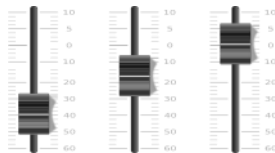
