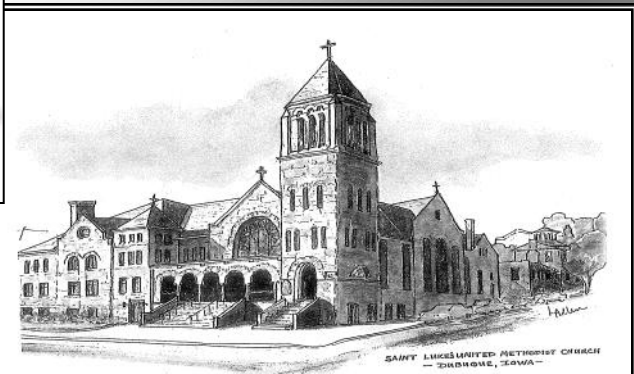

Chuck's Chat — July 12, 2017

A big part of my job as a pastor is to make connections between the physical and spiritual worlds. The first step is to help people pull back the curtain so they can see the spiritual world. The next step is to help people discover that the two are intimately related, and especially that we are denizens of both. A later step is to help people recognize that the spiritual world is the more real of the two.

Paul writes: "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Corinthians 5.17) We who are "in Christ" still touch the ground with our feet, and our eyes still take in physical light, but now we breathe the spiritual oxygen of heaven. We eat the bread of heaven, and drink the new wine of salvation. We are citizens of heaven, and ambassadors to earth.

This Fall and Winter, we St. Lukers will be learning together about *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*. It's a stewardship program written by Adam Hamilton. I am so looking forward to this, because it will give us tools to make the connection between the spiritual and the physical in a very basic area of life: our possessions and our resources. When I read the title, every word speaks to me:

ENOUGH: As a guy who collects cook books and fountain pens, I know the feeling of wanting more. When will I have bought *enough* of them? How can I possibly use even a portion of the ones I already have? What exactly is "enough?"

DISCOVERING: Isn't it exciting to discover a new way of looking at something? When God reveals a new insight to me, it brings me so much joy!

JOY: I want joy! I want to wake up happy to spend time living my life because I enjoy what I do and who I am. I want JOY!

SIMPLICITY: This is the scariest word for me! Yes, there's a whole industry that has been built up around helping people simplify their lives. How might God be inviting us to simplicity?

GENEROSITY: I have tasted the joy that comes from generosity, but I sort of do generosity in fits and starts. What might my joy be if I learn to live every aspect of my life generously? Although it can feel scary to be generous, especially if we only have barely enough for ourselves to get by, the Bible promises over and over that God will not let a generous person be injured by that generosity. (See, for example, several of the Proverbs: Proverbs 3:9; 11:24; 13:7; 14:21; 19:6; 21:26; 22:9; 28:27.)

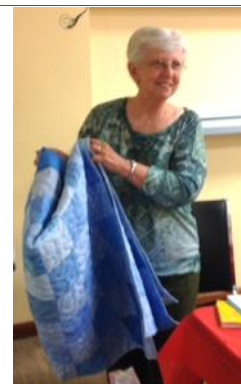
