## Chuck's Chat - March 21, 2018

On Sunday, March 18, our church experienced the beginning of a transition. Caprice Jones has been our custodian for about three years. On Sunday, he spoke at worship, thanking St. Luke's for affording him the opportunity to be of service, and for giving him the flexibility to pursue his dream.

That dream was given to him by God! That is his firm belief, and I believe it too. The dream is called *Fountain of Youth*. Caprice came to me about a year and a half ago, and said, "Pastor, I have an idea." He started outlining his vision for an organization that would provide training, mentoring, job placement, and a way out of "generational poverty thinking." He invited me to be part of it, and I became one of the founding members of the *Fountain of Youth* board of directors. What started as a sleepless night for one church custodian is now a 501.c.3 organization with multiple programs reaching people from age 16 on up who desire a new, better life.

The MISSION of the *Fountain of Youth* is:  
To change the mindsets that contribute to generational poverty. Our core focus is to serve underserved and underprivileged persons.

The VALUES are: Good community partner; Cultural integration; Good stewardship; Empowerment; Treating participants with dignity & compassion; Generational impact; and LOVE. You can't listen to Caprice talk for very long without hearing him say, "We gotta LOVE somebody!"

Friends, I am very proud that St. Luke's was the cradle where this baby known as the *Fountain of Youth* was nurtured and sustained. I'm proud of the program that it has grown to have both a building of its own and a paid Executive Director in the person of Caprice Jones, and another paid staff assistant. I hope and pray that many St. Lukers will spend some time getting to know the organization better, and will volunteer in some way.

*Fountain of Youth* is a wonderful "church" in everything but being outwardly religious. I say that for several reasons: First, I think it came about at God's command. Second, it has grown when many folks thought it would die — and it has grown because it is helping people. Third, it is sharing love with people, some of whom have precious little love in their lives. Fourth, it is an arena where volunteers can say, "Let's try this" and it often happens! This is a snapshot of a healthy growing church. My prayer is that St. Luke's will grow in very similar ways as we too exercise these same characteristics together.

## St. Luke's Garden Ministry Opportunities

It has been 8 years since we started our garden ministries, another of our outreach efforts to address food insecurity and injustice. Over the years, we have had many, many volunteers and participants from our community, which is how our ministries demonstrate "being church" in our community and how we model discipleship.

Although we no longer are planting the large church garden at the Purdy acreage, we still have two garden ministry projects. They are the Wading Pool Garden project and our Edible Landscape project. The Wading Pool Garden project is a program to provide a child size wading pool as a container and the soil, seeds and plants for the recipient to grow fruits, vegetables or herbs. The Edible Landscape project is a green effort to use urban space to grow food rather than to leave vacant or to mow.



We need the help of parishioners to continue these im-

portant ministries. You do not need to be a gardener to be able to help with the many tasks. These are some of the tasks for which we seek your help:

- Plant seeds and tend plants at the Dubuque Rescue Mission greenhouse. Times will be determined according to need.
- Assist the morning of May 5th with the Wading Pool Garden Fair.
- Be a Garden Guide for a new wading pool gardener or at one of the Residential Group homes.
- Help plant and tend the St. Luke's parking lot edible landscape and other areas, as needed and harvest produce from any area of our edible landscape.
