Brother Lawrence was known for his deep spirituality that played itself out in the most mundane aspects of daily life and service. He was known as the saint of the pots and pans. It's good to remember him when I have a day where it seems as though I have to wade through a tangled swamp of different tasks, rabbit holes and interruptions and never do seem to get to the things on my "to-do" list that look important to me.

When I begin to feel overwhelmed by such busyness, it's helpful if I'm able to stop for a moment, take a few deep breaths, and remember why I'm doing what I do – to be a representative of Jesus. It's all well and good to nod when we hear Jesus telling Martha that Mary has chosen the better portion by sitting at Jesus' feet and listening to him while Martha slaved away in the kitchen. I'm pretty sure, though that even if Jesus didn't care whether he ate, Peter and John's stomachs probably started growling around supper time.

That is to say, sometimes doing the "busy work" – especially when it ends up helping another person even in a small way – *is* placing ourselves next to Jesus. We may not be meditating or reading the Bible or writing a sermon, but when someone comes to us seeking help with putting a project together, or needs a listening ear, and we respond with patience and love, we *are* representing Jesus to that person.

There! I needed to hear that sermonette. I hope it helped you, too.

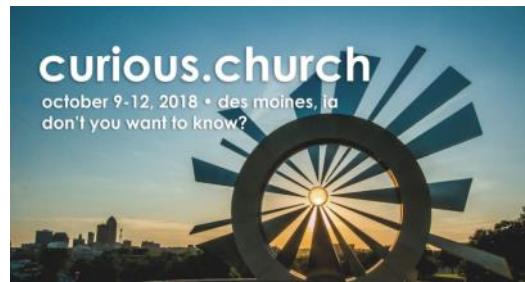
