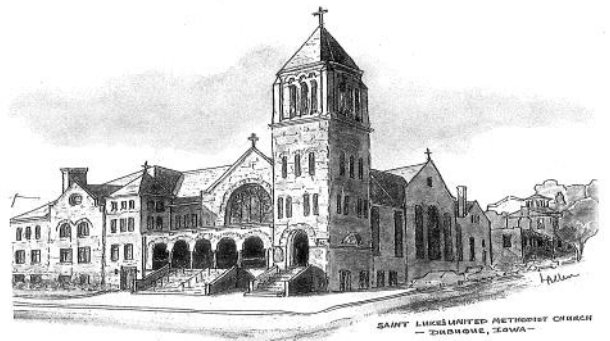

Chuck's Chat — October 18, 2017

I'm reading an interesting book called *The Holy Longing: The Search for a Christian Spirituality*, by Ronald Rolheiser. Yesterday, I was reading chapter 3, "The Nonnegotiable Essentials," where Rolheiser outlines what he sees as the essentials of spiritual living according to Jesus.

"...we see that Jesus was prescribing four things as an essential praxis {praxis means living out a faith system} for a healthy spiritual life: a) Private prayer and private morality; b) social justice; c) mellowness of heart and spirit; and d) community as a constitutive element of true worship.

For Jesus, these four elements comprise the essentials, the non-negotiables, of Christian discipleship. These are not elements we may choose or not choose to incorporate within our spiritual lives. They comprise the essence of the spiritual life. They also supply its balance. Only when all four of these are present in our lives are we healthy, as Christians and as human beings. (p. 53-4)

He goes on to describe these elements and also what it might look like if they are out of balance in different ways. This got me to looking at my own life. Do I live in this balance, or am I short on (or missing!) one or more element? Do I spend time daily in prayer, reading the scriptures, and working to order my life according to God's will for me? Do I work for social justice – both by regulating how I treat others, and by how I attempt to influence society for good? Is my heart "mellow?" By that, Rolheiser means things like, "do I think and feel the best about others? Do I lead with grace rather than with law?" and the like. And do I intentionally keep in communion with my faith community? Do I attend worship regularly? Do I meet with my faith family for prayer, Bible study, worship, and various kinds of service?

It is a reality of our human lives that each of us naturally gravitates to one or more of these elements, and finds others of them harder or less enjoyable. But I believe Rolheiser is correct in his reading of Jesus' teaching. I believe that as disciples of Jesus, we are challenged to make sure that each one is fully present and active in our lives. I also believe that it is the role of our congregation to help each of us to achieve this balance. Therefore, I hope to see you in church!
