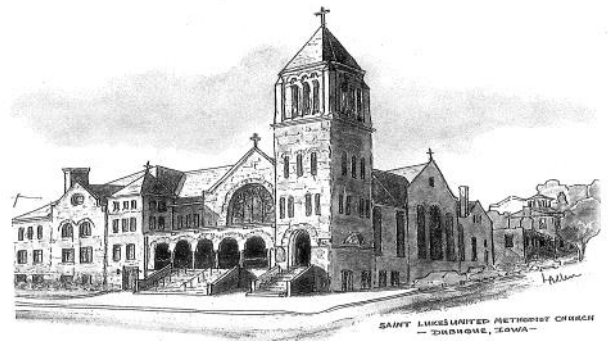

The Social Justice Co-Chairs would like to thank St. Luke's members for donating \$1,115 for Blankets, Hygiene Kits and Tools between Mother's Day and Father's Day that was sent to Church World Service for use around the country and abroad.

We also continue to be grateful for the participation of St. Luke's congregation in the Dubuque Area CROP Walk. The generous efforts of many Dubuque area congregations helped to raise \$13,610.02 in 2018. As you may recall, Church World Service uses the funds from the CROP Walk to provide resources for education, health care, community development, and emergency relief to more than 30 countries around the world. Twenty-five percent of the funds raised in Dubuque are returned to assist the needy through the work of the Dubuque Rescue Mission, the Dubuque Food Pantry, and People In Need.

The 2019 Dubuque CROP Walk will be held on Sunday, October 6 at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, 1755 Delhi Street. A free lunch for walkers will be held at Noon, with pictures and registration at 12:30pm. The walk starts at 1pm. St. Luke's sign-up sheet is on the white table in the south hallway.
