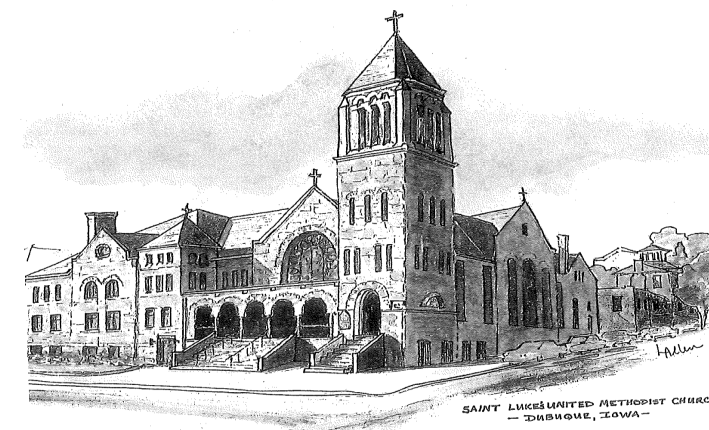

Summer Organ Concerts**

Don't forget the Summer Organ Concert series every Wednesday (June through August) at the Sinsinawa Mound Center's Our Lady of the Rosary Chapel at 7:00p.m. Admission is free. This week's concert features Jeffrey Verkuilen.

Jeffrey Verkuilen of Howard, Wis., will play the 7p.m. organ concert on July 15. Verkuilen is not only good at making sense of numbers as owner and president of Verkuilen and Associates CPAs, Inc, Green Bay, Wis., he is also good at turning notes into music as he serves as organist at First United Methodist Church in Green Bay as well as the Green Bay diocesan liturgies. He teaches organ as an adjunct instructor of music for St. Norbert College, De Pere, WI, and serves as the organist for the college's Dudley Birder Chorale. Verkuilen is the principal organist and an associate keyboardist for the Green Bay Symphony Orchestra and is an active member of the American Guild of Organists. He is a graduate of St. Norbert College with majors in accounting and music, with organ and choral emphases.

Details, registration and scholarship forms are available in South Hall for week-long and day Summer Urban Farm Camps (July 27-31 and August 5) in Cedar Rapids. These camps are for students in grades 3-5 who would enjoy exploring local foods and see up close how plants grow. Hands-on activities will allow participants to dive in, get their hands dirty, and have fun while learning about where food comes from. Activities include learning about growing food, creating healthy soil, composting, creating outdoor art, field trips and nutritious cooking of harvested foods.
