In June of last year we began keeping totals of the number of visitors to St. Luke's during the weekdays. From June 2016 through May 2017, St. Luke's has had roughly 4,200 visitors who have come just to see the Tiffany Windows. Most of these visitors come during weekdays in the summer from riverboats that stop in Dubuque like the Riverboat Twilight, the American Queen, or the American Duchess, however we have other visitors every week of the year even in winter.

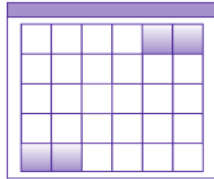
