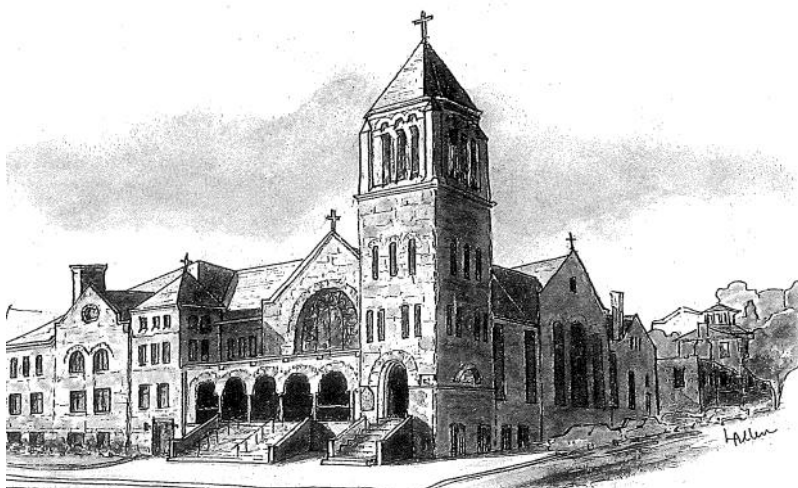

Each year the Food Pantry gives out hundreds of food baskets to needy families. St. Luke's will be assisting in this project in two ways:

The table will have beautiful shawls, scarves, and headbands from Limitless Horizons, an organization that works with the women of the Ixil area of Guatemala, marketing their hand-woven goods worldwide, allowing them an opportunity to earn a livable wage through their art.

## Advent 2: Peace

Our emphasis this week is PEACE. Too often we think of peace as simply the absence of war or conflict. But God's peace (in Hebrew, *shalom*) is actually the *presence* of life—life as it is meant to be, life in all its fullness, life in God. So while we may long for a world free from conflict, what God actually promises is a world full of life. A ruler born in a palace would know comfort, but a savior born in a manger knows, from the very beginning, life. A ruler who puts up with evil in order to “keep the peace,” to keep the wheels of government running smoothly, is not the same as a savior who sees evil in the temple and turns over the tables to restore peace and purity and prayer. And a ruler who finds “peace through strength” and conquers the world in order to keep it in line, cannot be compared to the one who, in weakness and submission, voluntarily gives up life so others can have it. Peace is always positive: not the absence of anything bad, but the presence of everything good.

## 2018 Prayer Partners



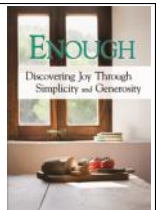

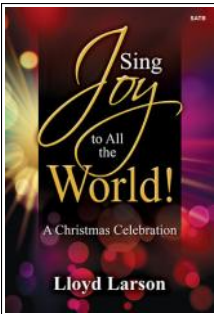


## Iowa Interfaith Power & Light
