

# Chuck's Chat - March 7, 2018

You have heard the phrase: "Laughter is the best medicine." With so many people sick with the flu and colds, we need all the medicine we can get. With so much seriousness and danger and anger in the world, we need a social lubricant that isn't addictive like alcohol or drugs, and that can help us to come together when it feels like society is fracturing.

For a full-scale essay on the many benefits of laughter, I recommend "The health Benefits of Humor and Laughter" from *HelpGuide.org*. Let me just share the headlines with you.

- Laughter is good for your physical health.
- Laughter is good for your mental health.
- Laughter helps you relax and recharge.
- It shifts your perspective, allowing you to see situations in a more realistic, less threatening light.
- Laughter draws you closer to others and strengthens relationships.
- Humor helps us to resolve disagreements and tension in our relationships.

Fortunately for folks who don't laugh a lot, it's a skill that can be learned. The essay has many suggestions. A few include:

- Smile. It is the beginning of laughter. Look at and smile at people.
- When you hear laughter, move toward it. Often people are very happy to share something funny, because it gives them an opportunity to laugh again.
- Spend time with fun, playful people.
- Ask people, "What's the funniest thing that happened to you today? This week? In your life?
- If all else fails, just laugh. For no reason. Do a big, sustained laugh. It will oxygenate your blood, give your innards a workout (internal jogging!), and relax your muscles.

At bible study this morning, someone wondered if Jesus and the disciples ever laughed. Seems the Bible doesn't say anything about Jesus laughing. My answer was, "You can't get a bunch of fishermen together without someone telling a fish story!"



# St. Luke's Garden Ministry opportunities

It has been 8 years since we started our garden ministries, another of our outreach efforts to address food insecurity and injustice. Over the years, we have had many, many volunteers and participants from our community, which is how our ministries demonstrate "being church" in our community and how we model discipleship.

Although we no longer are planting the large church garden at the Purdy acreage, we still have two garden ministry projects. They are the Wading Pool Garden project and our Edible Landscape project. The Wading Pool Garden project



is a program to provide a child size wading pool as a container and the soil, seeds and plants for the recipient to grow fruits, vegetables or herbs. The Edible Landscape project is a green effort to use urban space to grow food rather than to leave vacant or to mow.

We need the help of parishioners to continue these im-

portant ministries. You do not need to be a gardener to be able to help with the many tasks. These are some of the tasks for which we seek your help:

- Plant seeds and tend plants at the Dubuque Rescue Mission greenhouse. Times will be determined according to need.
- Assist the morning of May 5th with the Wading Pool Garden Fair.
- Be a Garden Guide for a new wading pool gardener or at one of the Residential Group homes.
- Help plant and tend the St. Luke's parking lot edible landscape and other areas, as needed and harvest produce from any area of our edible landscape.
