

## Chuck's Chat - May 16, 2018

Definition of janitor

1: one who keeps the premises of a building (such as an apartment or office) clean, tends the heating system, and makes minor repairs

2: doorkeeper (Latin – *janus*: arch)

Synonyms: caretaker, custodian, guardian, keeper, warden, watchman (From *Merriam-Webster.com*)

There is a tradition that Peter is the janitor at the gate of heaven. I am reminded of Psalm 84, that says, "For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness." Lately I have been doing some of the janitorial work here at St. Luke's. I enjoy the sense of accomplishment when a floor is freshly mopped, and I believe that I've been losing weight from the vacuuming, mopping, and bending over. I also enjoy knowing that I'm doing my part to make the St. Luke's building comfortable, safe and inviting. Almost every day, visitors walk in through our doors. Some come to see the windows, others are delivering packages, and still others come seeking some sort of help. For these people, I am always one of the "janitors" of our congregation – one of the doorkeepers, who welcome people and try to make them feel as though they have come home.

I have never felt as though there were some jobs that were "beneath me," or that were in some way demeaning. There are, of course, some jobs that I don't think I would *enjoy*, but that's a different sort of question. Any honest work—especially any work where a person is helping other people—is honorable. Where would we be if no one collected the trash and made sure that the sewers worked properly? What would we eat if no one caught and cleaned the fish, slaughtered the cows and pigs, or collected the eggs (a very smelly job in most hen-houses.) How would we enjoy our time of worship if no one had cleaned the sanctuary?

Whatever your job, I invite you to see it as "janitorial" in nature; that is, to see yourself as a "doorkeeper in the house of God." Do your work in such a way, and with such a spirit that people will recognize your joy and your love of God through your labor. And may God grant you such peace and contentment in your daily life that you are able to come to God's house on Sunday with a heart ready to praise and worship God.



**Megan Lynch** will graduate from the Alternative Learning Center, receiving her diploma from Hempstead High School. Megan's mother is Tammy Lynch.




### College




## Historical Memories — May

Originated by Rev. Rex Piercy, **Miracle Sunday, May 10, 1992** took place at St. Luke's United Methodist Church. Over \$209,000 was raised by the congregation in **one day**. The money was given for the organ restoration, air conditioning and mission outreach. Members were asked to give from their assets, not their income. Some cashed in stock certificates, sold fine art and other prized possessions. "Let heavenly music fill this place. Let mighty organ peal and roll and choirs in praise of God be heard... One great miracle!"

**May 16, 1897** - The newly completed Methodist Episcopal Church was dedicated at 12th and Main being debt free of the \$100,000 building cost. The official booklet, as pictured, shows the dedication was held for several days. According to the Dubuque Sunday Herald, May 9, 1897, "a magnificent modern temple of St. Luke's was completed. It is a monument to Methodism. Loving hearts and willing hands have contributed liberally to the work. Out of their means the members of the flock have given generously in proportions to the blessings that have been theirs and a magnificent structure has been erected."

Dr. George M. Staples, who he himself gave \$10,000 to start the building fund, passed away shortly before the dedication. In memory of Dr. Staples, the trustees decided to name the new church for the "Beloved Physician - St. Luke" and it was thus dedicated.

## S'more Jesus

Summer camp is just not camp without s'mores.

To make a s'more you roast (or burn, if that's your preference) a marshmallow over a fire and then squish it, along with a chocolate bar, between two graham crackers. It makes a delightful ooey-goey treat that, inevitably sticking to fingers and face, allows one to relish the sweetness long after it's gone.



The reason they're called s'mores is that you can't eat just one. You'll want some more, some more, and s'more! Campers quickly learn, however, that too many s'mores invite a belly-ache; and so, it seems, s'more s'mores have a very unfortunate downside.

There's another thing that campers crave s'more of: Jesus. Campers learn that, like s'mores, Jesus is sweet and sticks to you; unlike s'mores, however, s'more Jesus doesn't make you sick. It makes you well!

The Bible tells us that Jesus attracted crowds of people—thousands and thousands of people—who tasted his love or knew of others who had and wanted even more. He was irresistible! If we don't find Jesus irresistible it's probably because we need to do more than nibble around the edges. We need to take generous mouthfuls of Jesus by studying scripture with others, testing the power of prayer, serving and giving sacrificially, worshipping with the congregation, and denying ourselves the instant gratification of cultural "junk food," feasting instead on the body and blood of Jesus.

At camp children and youth are immersed in s'more Jesus 24-hours a day. They come home from camp wanting even more Jesus and excited to lead the church in its mission to share s'more Jesus with the world.

There are two points to be made here. First, children and youth are transformed into enthusiastic Christ-followers by camping ministry; they need your encouragement and financial support, and when they come home they need a path to service and leadership in the church and world. Secondly, as individuals and a church we are called to be the Jesus that makes the world well and to welcome the crowds who will inevitably want s'more.
