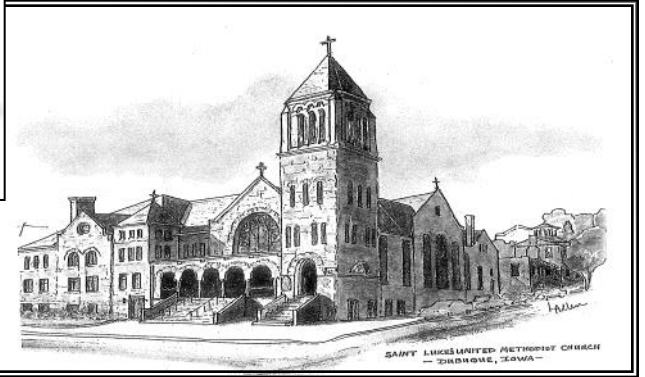

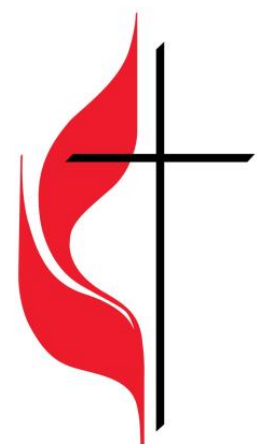

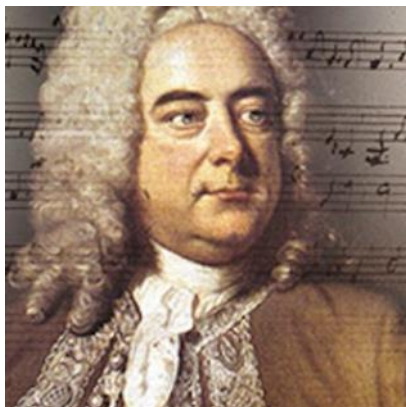

GRAND VIEW UMC, DUBUQUE

A special called General Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet in **February 2019**, in **St. Louis, MO**, to make decisions concerning our denomination's rules and positions on ordination of practicing lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender persons and on same-gender weddings being held on UMC property or officiated by UMC Clergy.

At this point, there will be **three proposals** or plans submitted to the General Conference by the Commission on the Way Forward. Each of these plans will have a direct impact upon local Churches. This meeting is an opportunity to **share information, ask questions, and begin reasoned conversation** among the United Methodists in the area about the future of our congregations in light of what our General Conference decides.

My goal is that our time together will be harmonious and productive! Thus, I would like information and facts about the work of the Commission, the Bishops, and the General Conference to be presented, and that we do our best to refrain from marketing or advocating strongly for a position, and certainly we refrain from arguments, labeling, etc.

The best outcome: that all United Methodists in attendance leave feeling better informed, that questions have been answered, and we all get a deeper sense that this is a pivotal time in the life of our denomination. **Please attend this meeting!**

If you make regular trips to Cedar Rapids or Waterloo, contact the Green Team to offer to take some glass for recycling on your next trip.

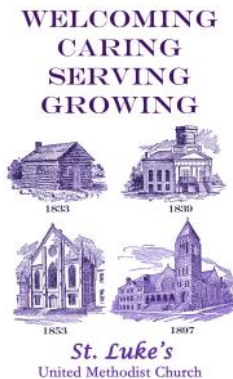
St. Luke's 185th Anniversary Shirts

Moravian Church in America Ratifies Full Communion Agreement with the United Methodist Church

June 22, 2018

BETHLEHEM, Pennsylvania - The Northern Province of the Moravian Church in North America on Friday, June 22, voted at its synod meeting in Bethlehem to enter into a full communion relationship with The United Methodist Church. With this action, the full communion agreement between The United Methodist Church and the Moravian Church in North America has been ratified.

The Southern Province previously approved the agreement at its synod meeting in April of this year and the General Conference of The United Methodist Church approved it at its meeting in 2016. The next step in the implementation of the agreement will for the two churches to establish a joint commission for the coordination of the full communion relationship.

The proposal for full communion between the Moravian Church in North American and The United Methodist Church was the result of several years of dialogue by the United Methodist-Moravian dialogue committee. The full text of the agreement can be found [here](#) (online).

The formalizing of this relationship is particularly significant given the historic links between Moravians and Methodists. The Moravian Church in North America [traces its lineage](#) back to the work of Czech reformer Jon Hus and his followers in the early to mid-15th century. In the 18th century, missionaries from the Moravian movement in London and colonial America played a significant role in the lives of John and Charles Wesley. It was under the spiritual tutelage of the Moravians that John Wesley came to a new appreciation for the deeply personal and experiential quality of faith in Jesus Christ. It was at a Moravian prayer meeting on May 24, 1738, that Wesley had his famous heart warming experience.

Wesley borrowed from the communal life of Moravian small group units called “bands” in his own organization of Methodist Societies and incorporated the practice of the [Lovefeast](#) into early Methodist spirituality.

Today Moravians are known to many through the annual publication of their widely used devotional [Moravian Daily Texts](#). You can learn more about the Moravian Church in North America [here](#).

A formal “full communion” relationship is one in which two or more churches publicly and visibly recognize one another as members of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic church. In such agreements the parties recognize each other’s sacraments, offices of ministry, and Christian mission as fully valid and authentic, while also maintaining the autonomy and distinctive gifts of each church. “A formal ‘full communion’ relationship,” states the Book of Discipline, “commits the churches to working together as partners in mission toward fuller visible unity” (§431.1c).



The Moravian Church in North American is already in full communion with The Episcopal Church and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The United Methodist Church is also in full communion with the ELCA and is engaged in [ongoing work](#) toward full communion with The Episcopal Church. Additionally, The United Methodist Church is in full communion with the following member churches of the [Pan-Methodist Commission](#): The African Methodist Episcopal Church, The African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, The African Union Methodist Protestant Church, The Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, and The Union American Methodist Episcopal Church.

Bishops, The Upper Room Launch Phase 3 of Praying Our Way Forward

May 23, 2018

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The Council of Bishops, in partnership with [The Upper Room](#), is launching Phase 3 of [Praying our Way Forward](#). [Phase 1](#) involved 84 members of the Council of Bishops praying for The United Methodist Church's way forward for 15 minutes daily, from August to December 2016. This was followed by [Phase 2](#), which resulted in 18 continuous months of daily individual and corporate prayer by faithful members of annual conferences around the globe.

"Now we are ready to launch Phase 3, which begins June 3 and continues through the [Special Session of General Conference](#) in February 2019. In this phase, we are encouraging every United Methodist to fast weekly and to pray daily with the [Council of Bishops](#)," said Bishop Al Gwinn, the Prayer Team Coordinator.

In Phase 3, all United Methodists are invited to:

1. Engage in a weekly Wesleyan 24-hour fast from Thursday after dinner to Friday mid-afternoon. Those who have health situations causing food fasts to be unadvisable might consider fasting from social media, emails or another daily activity.
2. Pause and pray for our church's mission and way forward daily for four minutes from 2:23 through 2:26 a.m. or p.m. in their own time zone OR at another time. This is because the Special Session of General Conference will be held February 23 through February 26, 2019.
3. Pray using a weekly prayer calendar that will be posted on the UMCPrays.org website from June 2, 2018, through the end of February 2019. The calendar will list a unique cluster of names each week. The names will balance United States bishops and delegates with Central Conference bishops and delegates. It will also include General Secretaries, Commission on a Way Forward members, the Commission of the General Conference and the staff of the General Conference.

"We urge every Annual Conference to use the video available on the [umcprays.org](#) website to promote Phase 3 of Praying Our Way Forward. There will also be a local church media kit with downloadable resources including logos, social media posts, and bulletin inserts available by Memorial Day," said Tom Albin, director of Spiritual Formation for The Upper Room.

Bishop Debra Wallace-Padgett, Council of Bishops Life Together chair, added: "We believe that the acts of weekly fasting and prayer will help us approach General Conference both individually and corporately in a posture of humility and receptivity to one another and to the leadership of God's Holy Spirit."
