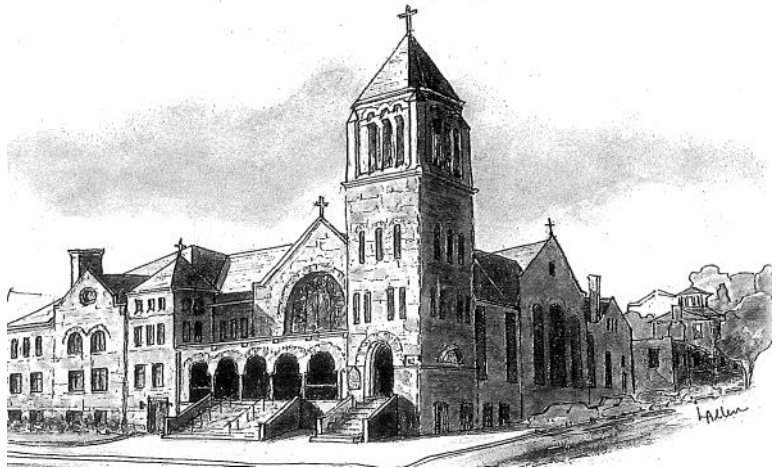

## Called to Reflection

Romans 12: 6-8

1 Corinthians 12: 4-11

Ephesians 4: 11-13

1 Corinthians 12: 12-31a (*read responsively*):

Leader: For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.

**ALL: For in the one Spirit were all baptized into one body — Jews or Greeks slave or free — and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.**

Leader: Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many.

**ALL: If the foot would say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,”**

Leader: That would not make it any less a part of the body.

**ALL: And if the ear would say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,”**

Leader: That would not make it any less a part of the body.

**ALL: If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be?**

Leader: If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be?

**ALL: But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them as he chose.**

Leader: If all were a single member, where would the body be?

**ALL: As it is, there are many members, yet one body.**

Leader: The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need for you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need for you!"

**ALL: On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable,**

Leader: And those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor

**ALL: And our less respectable members are treated with greater respect;**

Leader: Whereas our more respectable members do not need this,

**ALL: But God has so arranged the body, giving the great honor to the inferior member,**

Leader: That there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another.

**ALL: If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.**

Leader: Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

**ALL: And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, and third teachers;**

Leader: Then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues.

**ALL: Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles?**

Leader: Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?

**ALL: But strive for the greater gifts.**

Leader: The word of God for the people of God and all God's people say:

**ALL: Thanks be to God!**

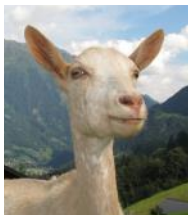
