





Record Attendance for Windows Tours

You may have heard that there were three excursion riverboats docked at the same time in Dubuque on Wednesday August 14th, including the Twilight, the American Queen, and the American Duchess. St. Luke's and our Tiffany windows are a regularly suggested sight-seeing destination for their guests while they explore downtown Dubuque. We also had a scheduled bus tour from South Dakota the same day.

On that day, we had a record attendance of 321 tourists and donations of \$588 for our Windows Restoration Fund. 

Volunteers are again needed this year to make Wonderful Wednesday meals happen:




