

A Word from the Pastor

Dear Church,

"What am I supposed to be learning?" This is the question I've been asking myself this week. Our world has been turned upside down amidst the pandemic of Coronavirus/COVID-19. I can't wrap my mind around how quickly things have changed, nor can I understand how long our life will be affected in this way. With that, there are a few things I'm learning. Aside from quickly learning new forms of technology and digital connections for church, I'm also learning some "heart lessons."

Sacrifice doesn't always mean doing more. Sometimes, sacrifice means doing less. Our world glorifies busyness and full schedules. In order to slow the spread of this virus, we must slow down our lives. The initial panic of this transition will calm, and I pray that through this time we will all learn from the slow down. The Christian response to this rapidly spreading illness is to sacrifice our plans for the sake of those for whom this virus could be deadly.

Walking through the unknown can either harden our hearts or build our trust in God. God's people are no stranger to unknown/wilderness times. I've been thinking a lot about how God's people wandered the wilderness with no end date in sight. They didn't know how God would provide for them. They didn't know what the next day would hold. So much of that is true for us now. As people who control so much of our lives, we aren't accustomed to walking through the unknown for long. This might be a season to learn how to trust in God's faithful love with our hearts, not just our heads.

The Psalm for this Sunday is Psalm 23. The Psalmist reminds us that God never says that we will avoid the valleys of this life. Rather, God says, I will walk with you through the valleys. That is true now. God is walking with us through this valley. May we have eyes to see.

Changes at St. Luke's UMC due to the COVID-19 Precautionary Measures

The church building is closed until further notice.

Sunday worship services will be recorded in advance and shared **online on the website Sunday mornings**. All newsletter subscribers will receive an email reminder.

Monday mornings may have limited phone availability, and mail service will be received on Mondays. Food vouchers will be mailed out on Mondays (homeless will still be able to enter the building to request vouchers if needed). Staff may be working from home, so email is the best form of contact at this time.

All other church events are suspended indefinitely or held virtually (online) until further notice.

Food for the Soul is going to continue by providing takeout and food giveaways <u>outside the church doors</u> on Saturday evenings 5-6pm. Food giveaway tables will be on the portico (assistance available for those with accessibility needs). Brown bag meals will be distributed by the Main Street level entrance. Additional safety precautions with food prep and distribution are being taken with <u>great care</u>. Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms, or who has a health condition vulnerable to COVID-19 is asked to <u>stay home</u> and <u>not</u> volunteer.
